| | Thousands to have medical, GP cards renewed for a year |

| | Health Minister Simon Harris yesterday announced that thousands of people covered by a medical card or GP visit card will have them automatically renewed for a year during the coronavirus crisis. It means that those whose card comes up for renewal will not have to worry about completing an updated application with the HSE. The move comes amid growing concern about the health needs of patients who do not have Covid-19 and fears about the impact on waiting lists as well as the reluctance to seek medical care during the crisis. The medical card and GP visit cards will reduce any financial disincentive for people on lower incomes to contact their doctor. People are being urged to contact their GP if they are not feeling well no matter the symptoms. |



Cork County Libraries lending musical instruments


