Access to emergency cash valued by 9 in 10 Irish people Over 1 in 10 reveal bank cards lost, stolen or frozen while abroad New research from An Post Money reveals 7 in 10 plan to travel in 2022

New research carried out by An Post Money has revealed that one in ten (12%) people in Ireland have had their bank card lost, stolen or frozen while travelling abroad; an experience 14% of men and 9% of women have encountered. More than 9 in 10 state that being able to access cash in an emergency situation while abroad is appreciated with the same number wanting to be able to access 24/7 customer support if their card is lost, stolen or frozen while abroad. A recent survey of over 1,000 Irish people by Red C Research was carried out, on behalf of An Post Money, to uncover insights into the travel plans and habits of people in Ireland in 2022.

After a long 24 months of enduring pandemic restrictions, An Post Money's research evaluates consumer sentiment as many prepare to travel abroad for the first time since before the Covid-19 pandemic began and since the cessation of travel restrictions earlier this year.

Top Destinations

- 7 in 10 are planning trips outside of Ireland
- Of those surveyed, over 1 in 4 people are planning to travel to the United Kingdom this year
- More than half of people plan to travel within Europe (54% for Continental Europe, excluding the UK) this year with 1 in 2 planning to travel outside of the Eurozone
- 1 in 6 are planning a long-haul trip to destinations including USA (8%), Canada (2%), Asia (4%), Australia and New Zealand (2%)

Financially Planning for Travel

- 1 in 2 (54%) people buy local currency ahead of a trip, with over 65's (68%) more likely than their younger counterparts to purchase local currency in advance.
- When it comes to the deciding factors on where they purchase foreign currency, 9 in 10 consider 0% commission and exchange rate important while 3 in 4 consider a convenient location to be important
- In the event of a lost or stolen bank card, more than 9 in 10 value access to emergency cash and similarly, over 9 in 10 value being able to access 24/7 customer support in this situation.

Approximately two-thirds of people who reach older age are likely to need care from others at some point in time. Access to good-quality long-term care is essential to enable older people to enjoy their basic human rights, fundamental freedoms, and human dignity.
