This National Community Engagement Week is designed to achieve the collaborative objective of increased community engagement and community reassurance throughout Ireland.









	Traditionally, the event has been held over the course of one day, in 2023, the event will now run for 5 days from 22nd to 26th May for National Community Engagement Week. Details of event locations are further down this page both in PDF and image format.
	Over the course of the week hundreds of communities, from all across the country will have the opportunity to meet with their local Gardaí and community representatives to discuss matters of importance to them such as rural safety, crime prevention and security. Stakeholders in these areas will be highlighting key aspects of their services to inform, guide and reassure the general public.
	The objectives of the week: Allow communities to meet and discuss safety concerns with their community Gardaí and other key stakeholders. Promote and inform best safety and security practices - share details on the use of innovation and education to improve community safety. Raise awareness of the many aspects of crime prevention and community safety. Empower communities to acquire advice and knowledge that promotes and maintains personal safety and security.

	Arts Roundtable Gathering – Thursday 15th June We are delighted to invite everyone involved in and / or interested in our programmes to register to attend our first Arts Roundtable Gathering on Thursday 15th June in Dublin. As many of you know, back in 2020 with the support of Creative Ireland, we founded the Arts and Creative Engagement programme to provide people with more opportunities to discuss dying, death, and bereavement. Since then, we have explored and collaborated with







numerous artists, cultural, health, community, state agencies, and educational organisations on ways to reduce the impact of bereavement on Irish people using a diverse range of creative practices.

The purpose of this event is to share learnings from the past three years, consider a spectrum of forms of loss and creative responses, and reflect on the benefits of creative work in loss and bereavement. Films from our Digital Assets Database will also be screened with a view to promoting discussion on potential strategies for developing a formal evaluation process on the impact of arts in mental health programmes generally.

FraudSMART Monthly Focus: Text Message Scams


Text message scams - Don't click on links, attachments, or images in an unsolicited text, and don't be rushed into responding.

Niamh Davenport, Head of Financial Crime at the BPFI, said, "Text message scams known as smishing *are targeting consumers in their everyday lives*. It is important to be aware of the risks posed by these scams and how to identify them. You will never receive a text from your bank directly seeking you confirm or verify your personal or financial details. If you are uncertain as to whether a text or email is genuine, ring your bank separately using the number on the back of your card, don't use contact details from the text or email. If you think you may have fallen victim to text or email scam, contact your bank immediately."
