	Minister Donnelly and Minister Butler announce government approval of Commission on Care
thejournal.ie	Government approves proposal for a Commission on Care for Older Persons to get underway in January 2024. Independent Commission to examine health and social care services and supports for older persons. Cross-departmental group to examine supports for positive ageing. Acknowledging the disproportionately negative impact of the pandemic on older persons, the Programme for Government: Our Shared Future (2020) commits to the establishment of 'a commission to examine care and supports for older people'. The Commission on Care for Older Persons will be an independent commission appointed by the Minister for Health and the Minister of State for Mental Health and Older People. Its work will be supported by a secretariat from the Department of Health. The target date for the establishment of the Commission is January 2024. <b>For full article please see link.</b>

Æ	The HSE's Autumn Winter vaccination programme gets underway today, Monday, 2 October with the roll out of the free Flu and COVID19 vaccines to recommended	
	groups. The COVID19 Autumn Winter booster vaccine is recommended for people aged 50 and over. The Flu vaccine is recommended for people aged 65 and over. Both vaccines are recommended for health and care workers, anyone who is pregnant or has a long-term health condition. Both vaccines will be available from participating GPs and pharmacists and can be given at the same time. Health and care worker vaccination clinics will also take place in many workplaces across the country.	
	HSE vaccination teams will also provide both vaccines for people living in residential care facilities including nursing homes as well as to housebound patients. To see what vaccines are recommended for you, visit <u>hse.ie</u> , call HSELive on <u>1800</u> <u>700 700</u> or talk to a <u>participating GP or pharmacist</u> .

	CervicalCheck asks women in their 60s to book their free HPV cervical	
	screening test	
	A further CervicalCheck test is now being offered to <b>women who were 60 – 65 years</b> <b>of age in 2020,</b> as they missed out on <b>the new HPV screening test</b> due to the cut-off for cervical screening being age 60 at that time.	
	From Monday, 2 <sup>nd</sup> October 2023, CervicalCheck will be writing to around 80,000 women to invite them to book a free HPV cervical screening test. Women in

# **Cross Border Intergenerational Initiative**





Following a successful funding application from the Department of Foreign Affairs, Shared Island Civic Society Fund a cross border intergenerational project in Balbriggan and the village of Mayobridge, Newry was established. This collaboration between Fingal County Council and Linking Generations Northern Ireland commenced on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2023 with a workshop for all participants in Balbriggan. The workshop questioned participants'

views on ageism and stereotypes and their understanding of intergenerational practice. However, it was not all work, and a drumming session provided an opportunity for all participants to learn a new skill, in a fun environment, suitable for all ages and abilities. The next step is for each group (Balbriggan and Mayobridge) to present their proposed projects at an event in Mayobridge on 14<sup>th</sup> October 2023.

## Launch of Cricket4All Guidelines



The Mayor of Fingal, Councillor Adrian Henchy launched Cricket4All Guidelines on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> September in County Hall, Swords. The Guidelines are the result of a collaboration between Fingal County Council and Cricket Leinster to pilot a multi-ability, intergenerational project in Balbriggan and Skerries with funding from the Department of Children, Equality,

Disability, Integration and Youth (DCEDIY) Disability Awareness Fund 2021.









The project saw coaching in adapted cricket and table cricket to young people with disabilities and to older people. The project created an environment where cricket is accessible to all, regardless of age or ability and facilitated diverse age and ability groups playing together in intergenerational teams for competition. The project's impact extended beyond the field, attracting volunteers who participated in coaching courses and disability awareness training.

The Guidelines are a valuable resource for cricket clubs, schools, active retirement groups and organisations working with young people with disabilities or anybody wishing to play Cricket4ll.

## Information Event for Over 55s: Sutton



Following successful information events in Dublin 15 in 2022 and in Swords in 2023, a further event took place in Suttonians Rugby Club on Thursday 14th September 2023. The event provided an opportunity for residents of Baldoyle, Sutton, Bayside and Howth to seek information and

advice on services and activities for older people in the area. Over 150 people attended the event.
