

#### What is Age Friendly?

Age Friendly Ireland's vision is to make Ireland a great country in which to grow old. The programme provides for a multiagency, multi-sectoral approach to age-related planning and service provision.

The Age Friendly Programme supports cities, counties and towns across Ireland to prepare for the rapid ageing of our population by paying increased attention to the environmental, economic and social factors that influence the health and wellbeing of older adults. Age Friendly programmes work to provide walkable streets, housing and transport options, access to key services and opportunities for older people to participate in community activities.

#### **Tipperary Age Friendly**

Tipperary Age Friendly work closely with other agencies in the county in our Alliance which meets quarterly. The core of Tipperary Age Friendly is the Older Peoples Council and the Executive Committee of the Older Peoples Council which meets 6 times a year. Tipperary Age Friendly at its heart is represented by the voice of the older person and a key phrase is that "if you design for the young, you exclude the old, but if you design for the old you include everyone".

### The overall Objectives of Tipperary Age Friendly Action Plan 2023

- to ensure older people feel connected and engaged within their local community
- to identify opportunities for older people to engage within their County economically, culturally and socially
- to ensure greater accessibility to shops, services, amenities and buildings
- to promote positive health and wellbeing as people age
- to ensure timely, quality and accessible services are in place to support older people to live independently in their own homes and to explore alternative housing options
- to promote a positive attitude to ageing and address stereotypes
- to work with and within existing community structures, businesses, networks & service providers in the County to enhance communications and build awareness of the needs of older people
- to build the capacity of older people to effectively engage with the systems, services and decisions that affect them
- To plan for the ageing future population and to provide for future needs
- Utilise and encourage available national grant schemes like RAPID, CLÁR, Town & Village Renewal and Community Enhancement Program Schemes to advance and advocate Age Friendly Projects
- To ensure delivery of transport systems and services that meet the varied needs of older people and enable them safe access to fully participate in all areas of life, engage with services and supports and interact socially. Delivery of mixed modes of transport should all be person-centred, affordable and fully accessible.
- To ensure information reaches older people and is delivered in an efficient and accessible manner



## **Tipperary Older Peoples Council (O.P.C.)**

Older Peoples Councils are established in every local Authority area of Ireland under the Age Friendly Programme. They are a vehicle to bring the voice of the older people into local government and help to inform private and public service provision. Older Peoples Councils are two tier structures that have a wide membership base representing all older people in the community and an elected Executive Committee.

The key role of the members is to provide the voice of older people to support the Alliance at strategic level in the delivery of its actions and to co design solutions in response to barriers and challenges. Membership is made up of individual older people and older people's groups.



- For Secured funding for Cycling Without Age provision which will be rolled out across the 5 Districts in County Tipperary. Cycling Without Age provides a community service connecting elderly people and those less abled with their community and the outdoors by giving them free rides on trishaws



- In June 2020 Tipperary Age Friendly supported the role out of the **Vulnerable Risk Register** scheme which had been piloted in the Nenagh Division. This service enables carers of those who suffer from dementia and Alzheimer's to register their details with the local Gardai so that in the event of an emergency those details can be accessed quickly to ensure the safe return of the loved one.
- Dementia: Understand Together creating dementia awareness
  - Tipperary Age Friendly have been active in supporting the development of Dementia Cafe network in the county

- Fidget Blanket Tipperary Town Library Craft Group. A fidget blanket helps provide stimulation for the fidgeting hands of Alzheimer's, dementia and autism. Its soothes the fidgeting by entertaining busying hands and fingers and stimulates their senses.
