NEW National Traveller and Roma Strategy II 2024-2028 published 31st of July

At national level, 15% of the total population were aged 65 years and over, compared with just 5% of Irish Travellers." NTRIS II 2024-2028 page 26 (Figures from Census 2022)

Travellers and Roma are amongst the most marginalised groups in our society. The Actions under the Strategy which seek to challenge attitudes and to address inequalities include:

- to tackle racism and discrimination in all their forms;
- to ensure public services are delivered in a culturally appropriate way;
- to enable Travellers and Roma to participate fully in all aspects of social, cultural and economic life;

• to improve access to accommodation;

- to support health and wellbeing;
- to ensure progression through education;
- to build opportunities in training and employment; and
 - to break the cycle of intergenerational poverty.


