Preparing for the Future: Co-Creation with Age Friendly Ireland on how best to plan for Copper Switch Over

On November 13th, we held our first meeting with Age Friendly Ireland and representatives from the Older People's Council. This collaboration is focused on ensuring that our communications and planning for Copper Switch Over are tailored to meet the needs and requirements of the older community. We're committed to listening and learning from your feedback as we move forward.

What does Copper Switch Over mean? Copper lines are the wires that support many traditional services in your home, like your landline, broadband connection (Internet), medical alarms and security alarms. open eir are deploying an alternative to Copper which is Fibre – the reason for this infrastructure change is to ensure our network is future proofed and ready to serve home and business users for many years to come. Fibre has lower faults, lower carbon emission and delivers a faster service for customers. Services that today may run on the copper network will migrate to the Fibre network in the future. Today, over 1.3million homes and businesses can migrate to our fibre.

While a complete transition from Copper to Fibre is still years away, we believe it's important to start planning now and keeping you informed every step of the way.

To help us plan effectively, we will be sending out a survey to Age Friendly Older People's Council members in the New Year. We strongly encourage you to complete and return it. Your insights will play a vital role in shaping our communications and ensuring we address any concerns you may have.

Our Key Message to you: There is No Need to Worry

We want to reassure everyone—you will get plenty of notice, no one will be cut off, and no copper will be removed from any home unless there is an alternative product available for you to use and you have been made aware well in advance. This process will be managed carefully, and we will keep you informed every step of the way.

Your participation and feedback are invaluable to us. We're here to ensure this transition is smooth, seamless, and supportive for everyone.
