COMMUNITY GRANTS OPEN FROM 17TH FEBRUARY 2025

Cork City Council wishes to invite applications for the Community Development Grant for Community Associations Capital Grant and Small-Scale Programme Grant 2025

This grant is split into 2 streams

- I. Community Associations Capital Grants 2025
- for recognised community associations in Cork City for works of a capital or major building maintenance nature. Funding to be awarded towards large scale capital grants between a minimum of €5,000 and a maximum of €35,000
- 2. <u>Small Scale Programme Grants 2025</u> For small scale programme activities excluding arts, sports activities and tree/flower planting.

The maximum grant that can be applied for will be €2,500.

Learn Something New GRANDPARENT SCAMS

What are Grandparent Scams?

They are a type of scam in which criminals pretend to be a family member to trick elderly victims into sending money.

The scammers call and claim they are a grandchild in trouble. They make up dramatic stories about being arrested, robbed or in an accident. The scam always involves impersonating a family member who needs money quickly.

How It Works?

Scammers research their targets on social media e.g. on Facebook, before calling them on the phone. They use the information they find to make their stories more believable. Scammers will often disguise their voices in some way, such as sobbing or mumbling. After speaking to the scammer pretending to be their grandchild, victims will be transferred to another scammer pretending to be someone who can help their grandchild, such as police or a solicitor.

What Do They Want?

The second scammer will say that they can help the victim's grandchild, but only if the victim sends them money immediately. They tell the victim to act quickly and not to tell anyone – otherwise, the victim's grandchild may be in legal trouble. The scammers will usually request payment in the form of gift cards or even send a courier to pick up money from the victim in person.

What Can I Do to Stay Safe?

Follow the tips below and share them with your family members to stay safe from phone scams:

- Most scams involve being asked to take urgent action. If you are contacted by a family member who claims to need money urgently, <u>call other family</u> <u>members to confirm the story before sending any money.</u>
- <u>Be cautious of sharing personal information</u> or family details on social media, as scammers can use this information to make their stories seem more believable.
- Be very skeptical if told to <u>make a payment using an unusual method</u>. Gift cards or someone coming to your home to pick up money from you would not be a normal way of paying a solicitor or other legal fees.
