Age Friendly Housing
Development Planned for
County Kildare



Kildare County Council has announced plans for a new Age Friendly housing development at Mill Lane, Leixlip, aimed at providing accessible and inclusive living for older residents. The project involves the construction of 36 purpose-built apartments.





Galway City Council awards contract for design and build of 84 residential units.

Galway City Council has announced that following a restricted tender process, the contract for the development of a new Social Housing scheme named "Fána an tSrutháin" at Ballyburke, Galway, has been awarded to OCC Construction.





Supporting Ageing in Place: New Paper Calls for National Nursing Home Care Policy

Nursing Homes Ireland has published a new Insights Paper calling for a dedicated, rights-based national nursing home care policy that supports older people to age with dignity, autonomy, and connection, whether in the community or in residential settings.

Titled Supporting Ageing in Place: Policy, Integration, and Nursing Home Care, the paper draws on a national policy roundtable held in February 2025 and outlines ten key themes that must be addressed to ensure high-quality, sustainable care for older people. These include access to therapies and diagnostics, safeguarding and resident voice, workforce planning, community engagement, and integrated care.

A central message is that nursing home care should not be viewed as a stepdown from community living, but as a vital continuation of the ageing journey for those with more complex needs. With Ireland's ageing population growing rapidly, the paper argues for greater alignment between community supports, housing with care, home care, and residential care, ensuring older people have real choice and continuity across all settings.

The paper also aligns with Ireland's wider Age Friendly ambitions, highlighting the importance of inclusive planning, co-designed policy, and the voice of older people in shaping services that truly reflect their needs and aspirations.
